# A store for boarder girls and posers

In The Daily Courier charts the growth of entrepreneurs in the Central Okanagan with this report about business starts

B londe is a boutique for boarder girls and powers. Boarder girls — for those not up on their lingo — are 17- to 27-year-old women who snowboard and wakeboard.

And posers are the women of all ages who don't necessarily snowboard or wakeboard, but want to dress like those who do.

"This store is full of streetwear and accessories for boarder girls," said owner Raegan Hall. "This is what boarder girls

wear when they aren't snowboarding or wakeboarding." Hall, 28, is a boarder girl, even

if she is one year outside age demographic.

"This is my personal dream wardrobe," she said. "I wanted to open an indepen-

dent fashion boutique that was open to new and different Canadian designers."

One of those 30 designers is Hall herself, whose line is called Polishu.

Poliahu is the Hawalian goddess of snow and perfectly represents the strong female who performs well on the water (wakeboarding) or snowboarding.

"The Poliabu line includes longer boarder shorts, bandanna pants, T-shirts and boodies," Hall said.

"I would have called the store Poliabu, but people don't know what it means, and it's too difficult to say, so I don't want to scare customers off. Blonde is short and sweet and understandable and has a good vibe."

Hall jokes that she's blonde and sweet, but not short. She's 5'10",

Hall draws ber inspiration from her passions, Hawaii, which she has visited almost annually and snowboarding, which she did professionally in 1894.

could snowbeard at Big White," she said. "And I can have my own store and continue designing."

After graduating from Kelowna Secondary school in 1956, Hall took a semester of university preparation on a tall ship called Class Afloat that sailed the South Facilic.

Then she did the stint of professional snowboarding.

From there, it was off to the University of Western Ontario and an honours time arts degree before going to New York City's famous Parsons School of Design for a fast-tracked fashion degree.

She landed a job with a small Vancouver label called Narcissist and designed dresses for if, 1999-2002.

Narcissist had a store on Vancouver's Main Street and supplied product to 180 other

"But I wanted to do my own

thing and design the kind of

clothes I wear myself," Hall said.
So, she did a bustiness plan. Hall found there's a strong niche market for boarder girl hishlon and Kelowna would be a good place for a boutique because Vancouver is already at the saturation point with the concept.

Besides Bonde, Pollahu liems are stocked at six other beutiques across Canada: Prozen Ocean in Vancouver and Halliax, Live to Surf in Tofino, Victoria's HTO, La Nina in North Vancouver and Hangers in West Vancouver.

After profiles in Flare and Vancouver Fashion magazines, Internet sales (poliaba.com) have taken off.

Hall sends her designs to Vancouver to be made, but she's looking for a contract sewer in Valcours
